

St. Paul's is committed to providing worship opportunities to ensure all have an opportunity to safely worship. Below you will see different ways to worship and what to expect at each service. **Newly updated information is highlighted in yellow.** We will continue worshiping in our sanctuary along with continuing to stream worship on our Facebook page.

9:30 AM Indoor Worship

Masks	St. Paul's Council encourages face mask wearing for all individuals—fully vaccinated and unvaccinated. It is most important to wear a well-fitted mask correctly that is comfortable for you and that provides good protection. This encouragement applies to all indoor gatherings and meetings in our buildings at St. Paul's. Disposable surgical masks are available for your use prior to entering the sanctuary.
Distancing	We continue to ask you to distance, sitting every other pew.
Communion	Communion will continue to be distributed via disposable communion kits
Singing	We will continue singing limited verses of hymns
Bulletins	Weekly bulletins are emailed out by Saturday of each week and also found on St Paul's Website—please bring with you to worship. Our indoor worship service can be viewed on our screen via PowerPoint, so bulletins may not be necessary for some.
Offerings	Offering container is available as you enter the worship space for placing your offerings before or after worship.
Windows	Windows and doors will be opened, when possible, to allow for ventilation

COVID-19 spreads from person to person through respiratory droplets that travel into the air when you cough, sneeze, talk, shout, or sing. **The current 'Omicron variant' is even more contagious. Therefore, we especially encourage wearing a well-fitting mask over your nose and mouth when in our buildings.** CDC issued a new mask guidance 1/14/2022: **Masks can provide different levels of protection depending on the type of mask and how they are used. Loosely woven cloth products provide the least protection, layered finely woven products offer more protection, well-fitting disposable surgical masks and KN95s offer even more protection, and well-fitting NIOSH-approved respirators (including N95s) offer the highest level of protection.** For more information from the CDC on wearing masks and mask types go to their site: www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/types-of-masks.html
